

DEVELOP A PROCESS-ORIENTED ORGANIZATION (FPO1)

Learn knowledge and practice-oriented tools for developing and leading a process-oriented organization

Objectives

The aim of this two-part seminar (FPO1 and FPO2) is to provide participants with knowledge and practice-oriented tools for building a process-oriented organization. Holistic process management is becoming a key success factor for effective business leadership. The core challenge lies in anchoring processes and their management and control comprehensively within the organization. This includes the systematic integration and process-oriented alignment of organizational structures, corporate culture, and leadership principles. In both FPO seminars, we use the BPM&O model as a sustainable approach for establishing and embedding process-oriented organizations.

To fully cover all relevant content, participation in both seminars is required. We recommend starting with module FPO1, followed by FPO2.

This module, FPO1, focuses on building BPM governance, including the development of a target vision for process management and sustainable process orientation. Approaches for designing and managing process-oriented organizations are presented in connection with a company-wide role model, and possible implementation options are developed. In addition, sustainable approaches to the BPM&O model's "Competencies" component are addressed to build and anchor capabilities for process-oriented leadership and control within the organization.

The Designing Process-Oriented Organizations (FPO1) seminar is offered as a blended learning format. Participants complete three self-paced e-learning modules — accessible anytime and from anywhere — and learn the approaches to designing process-oriented organizations and the corresponding competency framework in a two-day intensive in-person training. Extensive exercises based on a case study are conducted and real-world examples are presented.

The e-learning content is available for a period of 3 months after participants receive access to the BPM&O E-Learning Platform.
